



Irish Palatine Heritage Tour 2016

Ten days of exploring Irish Palatine Heritage in Ireland

9th – 19th of September 2016

Further to the success of our past tours in Germany and Ireland the Irish Palatine Association wish to announce a 10-day event in Ireland to run between 9th and 19th of September 2016.

On this occasion we will visit new areas associated with the Palatines in Ireland with guest speakers on different aspects of their story as well as visits to an array of new tourist attractions. There will be musical events, banquets and other entertainment. Various bodies will host receptions and dignitaries will meet the group.

In Dublin we plan to visit Collins Barracks, formerly known as the Royal Barracks. It is here that the Palatines were initially housed on arrival in Ireland in 1709. The Barracks is believed to have been the longest serving army base in the world when the Irish Army moved out in 1997. The site was taken over by the National Museum of Ireland, extensively renovated and now houses the Museum's Decorative Arts & History collection. The main square is known as Palatine square and the complex features a meeting room called "The Palatine Room" to mark the Palatine connection. <http://www.museum.ie/Decorative-Arts-History/History-Architecture>

We will also visit Switzer's Store (now Brown Thomas) the most famous department store in Ireland and founded by the Switzer family. A

mosaic sign "Switzer & Co Ltd" from the art nouveau entrance doors on Wicklow street still remains in situ. (See *IPA Journal 13. Pgs. 24 – 33*)

The Abel Ram Estate in County Wexford was home to two parent Palatine colonies at Gorey and Old Ross. We will be stopping at St. Mary's Church of Ireland in Old Ross where generations of Palatine families have worshipped and we hope to meet some of the living descendants including Ruttles, Pooles and Rynharts. We will tour the Dunbrody Famine Ship, commissioned by a merchant family from New Ross and built in Quebec in 1845 by an Irish emigrant. The Ship brought timber from Canada, cotton from the southern states of the U.S.A. and guano from Peru. In 1845, the very year of her launch famine struck Ireland. The Dunbrody carried thousands of emigrants to North America. <http://www.dunbrody.com>

We will view the Ros Tapestry Project, a massive community initiative in progress in the County of Wexford. Conceived in 1998, it is being developed by over a 150 dedicated volunteers. Fifteen striking embroidered panels - 6 x 4 foot

each - it is a cultural and historical accolade to its creators. <http://www.rostapestry.com>

Ballyseede Castle was originally the home of the Blennerhassett family who settled Palatines on their lands at Ballyseede and Ballymacelligott near Tralee, Co. Kerry in the 1740's. The house is now a four star hotel where we will have dinner and hear the history of the house. Earlier on this day, we will attend the local Church of Ireland service and have an opportunity to meet local Palatine families.

Another area of Palatine settlement was the Leslie estate in Tarbert. We will visit the Bridewell (historical jail and courthouse) to learn how prisoners were dealt with there in the 19th century. <http://www.tarbertbridewell.com>

From Tarbert we will cross the Shannon estuary by ferry to visit selected tourist attractions in County Clare.

In Kilcooley Co. Tipperary, the Palatines were invited to settle on the Barker estate in 1772. As well as seeing sites of Palatine interest a lunch will be hosted by some descendants of those families. We will be visiting nearby Kilkenny where there will be an opportunity to visit Kilkenny Castle, an Anglo-Norman stone castle built c.1146-1219) and the Kilkenny Design Centre home of the National Craft Gallery housed in the coach houses and stables of the Castle.

We will also be visiting the Limerick Palatine settlements where there will be tours of the parent colonies of Courtmatrix, Killeheen and Ballingrane including the Embury Heck Memorial Church as well as the secondary settlement of Adare where we will highlight sites associated with the Palatines.

During the course of the 10-Day tour there will be talks on various topics of Palatine interest by respected authorities including Dr. Vivien Hick on the Wexford Palatines ; Dr. Patrick O'Connor on other aspects of the Palatine Story and Padraig O'Concubhair on the story of the Methodist Society and the Palatines in Tarbert. There will be input from Limerick University, Centre for Irish-German Studies and other bodies as well.

Rathkeale House Hotel will be providing accommodation for our guests for the duration of the holiday programme.
